FAQ ABOUT LIONS

When are my Dues due?

Your Lions Club decides when your member dues are due, however, half the District, Multi District and International Dues are billed to each Lions Club twice per year in August based on club membership as of July 1 and in February based on membership as of January 1. Each Lions Club, therefore, should have sufficient funds in their Administrative Account to pay their dues obligation in the month billed.

What happens if we fail to pay dues?

Remember the oath you took when you were inducted into your Lions Club, "I promise to pay my dues on time." If you don't and you remain as a member of your club, your club still has the obligation to national Dues when billed. If your Lions Club remains delinquent in payment of dues for more than 90 days, the Lions Club Charter may be revoked which means the club can no longer act as, or portray it-

self as, a Lions Club. Reinstatement, although possible, is expensive and time consuming, time that could better be applied to serving our community.

As a Lion in District 12-N, how much are my dues?

Your Lions Club decides the amount of your club membership dues. Your club membership dues pay District, Multi-District and Inter- cover costs for club operations plus District Dues (\$16.00), Multi-District Dues (\$4.60) and International Dues (\$43.00). For Students between the age of 18 and 30 years of age who file a form STU-5, all dues are ½ the above rates.
