My District 12N convention will be February 20th and 21st, 2015 in Johnson City, Tennessee. The venue will be The Carnegie Hotel, a triple A Four Diamond Full Service Hotel. It is patterned after the original Carnegie that was built in 1891. It was advertised then as the best built, best equipped hotel in East Tennessee with room rates of \$2.50 per day and upwards. You will really like it and I have negotiated a favorable room rate (of \$89) only till January 20<sup>th</sup>, 2015. That is the date they will release my block of rooms (then its \$140 a night).
