Notice of Constitution and By-Laws modifications to be voted on at the February District 12-N Convention

The following changes are required by action LCI in adopting new or altered language for the Standard District Constitution and By-Laws.

<u>District 12-N Constitution Article VII, Section 2., last paragraph, last sentence, by amending language as follows:</u>

"Delinquent' dues must be paid and good standing acquired at any time up to fifteen (15) days* prior to the close of credential certification, as such closing time shall be established by the rules of the respective convention.

<u>District 12-N Constitution, addition of Section 4. to ARTICLE XI;</u> "Section 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. Each amendment shall take effect at the close of the convention at which adopted unless otherwise specified in the amendment."

<u>District 12-N By-Laws</u>, addition of Exhibits "D" through "G" that state as follows:

Sample 1: Ballot where there are two candidates.

Instructions: Clearly indicate your vote by placing an appropriate symbol in the box next to the name of the candidate you are casting your vote for.

Sample 2: Ballot where there is only one candidate.

Instructions: Clearly indicate your vote by placing an appropriate symbol in the box indicating a yes or a no vote for the candidate.

Sample #3: Ballot where there are three or more candidates:

(Note: there are a few different options when there is more than one candidate. If time permits, you may have the voter indicate their selection next to the candidate they wish to vote for. If no candidate receives a majority of the votes, then the candidate with the lowest amount of votes is dropped off the ballot and another vote is taken (The ballot would look like Sample #1 above). This process would continue until a candidate receives the required number of votes. As most districts do not have the time to conduct such a lengthy process, the option of Preferential Voting allows the voter to complete one ballot. Following is an example of a Preferential Voting Ballot):

Instructions. Indicate your preference by clearly marking next to each candidate's name a number (1,2,3)

or 4) indicating your preference in the order in which you would elect the candidate (i.e., 1, representing

highest preference, 2 – next preference, etc).

Rules for Preferential Voting:

1. On the preferential ballot - for each office to be filled the voter is asked to indicate the order in which he prefers all the candidates, placing the numeral 1 beside his first preference, the numeral 2

beside his second preference, and so on for every possible choice.

- 2. In counting the votes for a given office, the ballots are arranged in piles according to the indicated first preferences one pile for each candidate.
- 3. The number of ballots in each pile is then recorded for the tellers' report. These piles remain identified with the names of the same candidates throughout the counting procedure until all but one are eliminated as described below.

 4. If more than half of the ballots show one candidate indicated as first choice, that choice has a majority in the ordinary sense and the candidate is elected. But if there is
- no such majority, candidates are eliminated one by one, beginning with the least popular, until one prevails, as follows:
- a. The ballots in the thinnest pile that is, those containing the name designated as first choice by the fewest number of voters are redistributed into the other piles according to the names marked as second choice on these ballots.
- b. The number of ballots in each remaining pile after this distribution is again recorded.
- c. If more than half of the ballots are now in one pile, that candidate is elected. If not, the next least popular candidate is similarly eliminated, by taking the thinnest remaining pile and redistributing its ballots according to their second choices into the other piles, except that, if the name eliminated in the last distribution is indicated as second choice on a ballot, that ballot is placed accordingly to its third choice.
- d. Again the number of ballots in each existing pile is recorded, and if necessary, the process is repeated by redistributing each time the ballots in the thinnest remaining pile, according to the marked second choice or most-preferred choice among those not yet eliminated – until one pile contains more than half of the ballots, the result being thereby determined.

There are two other matters for consideration as amendments to the District 12-N Constitution and By-Laws; A) Practice of Certifying Past District Governors as Delegates apart from a Club Delegate Quota to the District Convention, and B) Campus Club dues relief.

- It has been the practice of District 12-N to Certify Past District Governors as Delegates apart from the Club delegate quota even though not expressly permitted by the District 12-N Constitution. This practice is permitted pursuant to ARTICLE IX, Section III of the International By-Laws only as an express provision of the respective District Constitution and By-Laws. In order to bring the District 12-N Constitution and By-Laws in compliance with the District 12-N practice, the following language is proposed to be added as the last sentence of Article VII, Section 2 of the District 12-N Constitution:
- "Full delegate status is granted to each Past District Governor who is a member of a Club in good standing in District 12-N independent of Club delegate quotas." B) Dues relief for Student Lion members, as first introduced at the 2014 District Convention, was codified as a resolution for amending the District 12-N By-Laws by the West Knox Lions Club and submitted to the District Constitution and By-Laws Chair in accordance with ARTICLE XII, Section 1, (a) of the District 12—N By-Laws and ratified by the 12-N Cabinet at its November 14, 2015 Cabinet meeting. As a result, the following is offered as language effecting District 12-N By-Laws, ARTICLE VII, "District Administrative Fund."

Insert the following as Section 2:

"Section 2, STUDENT MEMBERSHIP DUES. For Student membership programs as adopted by the International Board of Directors, eligible student members shall pay semi-annual dues equal to one-half (1/2) of the total amount of dues as provided for in Section 1. above."

Re identify existing Section 2, **REMAINING FUNDS** as "Section 3" with associated change in the Table of Contents
