From the District Governor:

As Lion Silvia and I have attended all the other Tennessee District Conventions, we came to realize how great the work of Lionism is happening all over our state. At the District I Convention at Henry Horton State Park, the Tennessee School for the Blind's chorus sang for us. One blind girl, abandoned by her mother shortly after she was born,

has become a talented sculptor of clay, selling her works for hundreds of dollars. At the District L convention in Jackson, the Lions showed off their Lions Mobile Eye Clinic vehicle. All the districts have special projects, but I feel none can top ours. Our Lions Volunteer Blind Industries in Morristown and Johnson City is unmatched. The East Tennessee Lions Eye Bank is one of the most successful in the country and the District 12-N Charities is the best organized effort in giving in our state. Our assistance to the Recording for the Blind and Dyslexic, Remote Area Medical, Tennessee School for the Deaf, the Braille Slate Project, and many others raises us to the top. We also lead the state in KidSight screenings. Yet, we still have some issues. Our clubs are not supporting the 12-N Charities like we used to, meaning we have to give less, even though the needs are growing. We are not the largest district anymore and District S has outgrown us without a major city in their area. District L is the only District in Tennessee with positive membership growth since last July. We have done well in bringing in new members, but are not doing as well in keeping them. Please use dropping members as a last resort. This is a large reason a dues increase was needed, as we are shrinking but the need to support our leaders and charities has not. Please support our district as a club. We are all linked together, Internationally. Let us show the others we are the best team in Lions, we are DISTRICT 12-N, it is time to ROAR!

Lion John Buckley of the West Knox Club and his wife, Sue, both of whom are blind, have begun mentoring blind and visually impaired youth who are transitioning from school. Club VIBES (Visually Impaired and Blind Enhanced Services) is intended to supplement skills that "vision teachers" in the school system simply lack time to cover. "Our goal," John says, "is to encourage the young people to be independent and productive." The Club combines social activities with necessary skills for life after school. Sue works with the young people and John works with their parents in bi-monthly meetings. When appropriate, the Buckleys work with club members individually as well. "Parents and teachers tell us," Sue says, "that the young people are more likely to listen to us because we are blind professionals who have been there and done that." John is retired from teaching at UT, and Sue was the Sr. Vice President of the YMCA OF Memphis and the Mid-South.

On Saturday, May 22, the Club will be sponsoring a fund-raiser at the Bijou Theatre in Knoxville to expand its services. Russ and Becky Jeffers and the Smokey Mountain Sunshine Band and Phil Campbell, son of Archie Campbell of the Hee Haw TV show, will be the featured performers. Showtime is 7:30, and all Lions are encouraged to come and support the Club and have a great evening's entertainment. 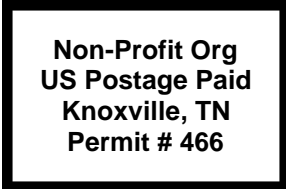

Proposed Changes to MD By-Laws to be Voted at State Convention

ARTICLE V—State Committees

Section 2. International Convention Committee:
Delete Section 2 including Paragraphs A, B, C, and D. in its entirety in the MD 12 By Laws and in its place insert the following:

Section 2. **International Convention Chairman: Choice:** The Multiple District Council shall enter into a contract with ONE individual or **entity**, to serve as the Multiple District International Convention Chairman. This Individual should have knowledge about The Lions of Tennessee and their participation in the upcoming Lions International Convention. District Governors are encouraged to appoint non-reimbursed International Committee members to provide information and encourage Lions in their district to attend the LCI Convention.

Duties: This individual or entity, will have total responsibility for all pre-convention administrative activities that must be completed, as well as all on site administrative duties to insure the Lions of Tennessee are able to participate in all events deemed appropriate. The State Council shall identify and approve the specific events that must be covered, as well as the funds that will be paid to the individual to accomplish all specified duties.

Reports:

1. The State Council at the Multiple District Organizational Meeting shall report the name of the individual contracted to be the International Convention Chairman, the activities to be covered, and a budget approved for completing them.
2. The International Convention Chairman will prepare a written

report of the Multiple District's participation in the Lions International Convention which must be read at the next State Convention; filed with the permanent records of the Multiple District; and mailed to all Clubs in the State Council within sixty (60) days after the close of the Convention.

3. By the end of the fiscal year, the International Convention Committee Chairman will prepare an itemized Financial report for auditors and presentation to the State Council and at the new Multiple District Cabinet meeting and at next State Convention.

Pending State Convention approval of the Article V, Section 2 The following amendment to Article XIII, State Revenue, Section 3, International Convention Fund, Paragraph B. Budget, Item 1, Will be corrected to read:

The International Convention Committee (add) 'Chairman' shall prepare and present plans and budget---etc.

With the passage of this amendment the affective date will be July 3, 2010.

Article V, Section 6, State Trading pin Committee, Paragraph A.

A. Appointment: The members of this Committee may be any Lion in good standing and who has attended at least one (Delete) International Convention within the last 10 years (insert in its place) State Convention within the last five years. Each District Governor shall appoint one member as soon as possible --- (no further change) to this Par A.
