#### Don Britton announces retirement from LVBI

Fellow Lions, I will be retiring as CEO of LVBI in December of 2014. What a ride! I have spent a very fast 42 years working for Lions Volunteer Blind Industries in various capacities, from temporary salesman, to trainer, rehabilitation director, and finally CEO of this wonderful organization.

In LVBI's 62 year history, over 600 blind people have been paid wages as our workers, and hundreds of others have benefited from the services of our rehabilitation center. This has all been possible because a previous generation of Lions in District 12-N answered a call to provide employment opportunities to our blind Tennesseans. Our mission to "provide blind people with the dignity of independence through employment" stands strong today because today's Lions accept the torch and continue their support of this District 12-N project.

LVBI would not exist had it not been for the Lions of District 12-N. As my successor, Trevor Southerland, takes over the leadership of LVBI, I want to encourage you to extend your helping hand to him, as you did to me in 1972.





Being a Lion is one of the most exciting and rewarding experiences in my life. As Jackie and I travel, we see the Lions symbol in many cities and towns that we pass through. It warms my heart to see that good is being done not only locally but all across this country and abroad. Whenever we meet a Lion they always

smile and hold their heads high and tell about the great things their clubs are doing and the things they want their clubs to achieve.

It was a gift to me from Lion Dr. Ray Lipps that allowed me achieve these experiences. He told me about Lionism and invited me to a Farragut Lions Club Charity Event.
