EAST TENNESSEE LIONS EYE BANK ANNUAL MEETING

The annual meeting of the East Tennessee Lions Eye Bank will be held Friday, February 23, 2018 at approximately 7 PM (after dinner) at the MeadowView Resort, in Kingsport, TN., in conjunction with the District 12-N Convention. The business to be conducted will be annual reports and the election of five (5) members, for a three (3) year term, to the Board of Directors of the East Tennessee Lions Eye Bank.

Also, to be discussed and voted on are 2 changes to the Charter of the East Tennessee Lions Eye Bank;

- 1. To stipulate that only one percent (1%) of the Corporations members need to be present at the annual meeting to have a quorum for conducting business.
- 2. Under Action by Written Consent; to be added under paragraph 6 of the Charter: That action taken by written consent shall not be deemed a proxy.

District-wide Public Relations Board Competition

One of District 12-N goals for 2017-2018 is to aid the Clubs in becoming more visible and better understood in their communities. To help accomplish this, we are announcing a District-wide Public Relations Board Competition which will end on February 24, 2018, at the 12-N convention.

The winner will be determined by \$1 vote of those attending the Convention. There is no limit to the number of \$1 votes by any Club or individual Lion. A monetary prize reflecting votes cast will be awarded for the top entry, and each Club submitting an entry will get some money to help offset expenditures. But the real winners will be every Club that makes an effort to help themselves! You end up with your personal portable "billboard" that can travel along as your Club members go about serving in your community.

Here are the five rules:


- Only tabletop display boards will be accepted for judging, but they may be of any type or size. Including
 multimedia is OK, but the main thing is the PR Board itself.
- 2. The LCI logo must appear somewhere on the PR Board.
- 3. Your Club name must appear somewhere on the PR Board.
- 4. Subject matter of the PR Board will be determined only by the needs of your Club.
- Entries must be received after 3:00 PM on Friday, February 23, 2018, and are to be displayed for \$1 voting at the District 12-N Convention at MeadowView Convention Center in Kingsport. Voting begins Friday and closes previous to the beginning of the Saturday afternoon Business Session.

And here are some suggestions for success:

- Think through the purpose of your PR Board and how you want it to speak for your Club. Your excitement for your subject will show through!
- Use your Club's Public Relations Chair and/or a person who is good at scrapbooking.
- Photos or illustrations should be interesting. Consider using action photos as talking points.
- Be aware that not all photos enlarge equally well. Look at the digital size, and ask the service person at the
 photo printer if you are not sure about enlarging certain ones.
- · Any person who can be identified in a photo must give permission for their image to be used.
- Any verbiage should be informative and brief. Simple is best.
- · Remember to make everything large enough to be seen from several feet away.
- Corrugated or foam core tri-fold boards start at about \$10 and are widely available. If your Club can afford
 the investment, the substantial tri-fold boards that accept Velcro will last for years and can be repurposed
 as needed. Those come with carrying cases and run about \$130 on-line. Purchase the self-sticking Velcro
 dots and use to attach items. Gluing the sew-on Velcro strips does not work!
- . Many interesting and creative items purchased for \$1 can help you create a beautiful PR Board.

The PR boards shown below were made specifically as an example and will not be entered in the contest. You are free to steal ideas but please do make your board your very own – be original!


