





## DISTRICT 12N CABINET MEETING – SEPTEMBER 28, 2019 WHITE CANE REPORT

**International White Cane Safety Day** - October 15th, adopted by the International Federation of the Blind, is an opportunity to increase awareness about the white cane and is observed worldwide to recognize the movement of blind people from dependency to full participation in society. White cane laws are on the books of every state in the U.S. and a few other countries providing persons who are blind a legal status in traffic.

Throughout the world, the long white cane is used by people who are blind or visually impaired as a tool for safe and reliable navigation. However, interestingly enough only about 8% of the visually impaired use white canes — they use guide dogs or a sighted guide. Some white canes are going high-tech with ultrasonic devices that detect obstacles up to nine feet away.

There are three different kinds of white canes. Standard mobility cane used to navigate, the support cane used by visually impaired who also have mobility challenges and the ID cane, a small, foldable cane used by people with partial sight to let others know they have a visual impairment. Today's modern lightweight canes are usually made from aluminum, fiberglass or carbon fiber and can weigh as little as seven ounces. Some white cane users prefer the straight canes which are more durable while others prefer the collapsible canes.

## IMPORTANT TIDBITS FROM THE LIONS DISTRICT 12N FALL CABINET MEETING

DG Carol reminded clubs to bring a basket for auction to the LLR and to also bring items to be donated for the Silent Auction at the District Convention.

PDG Chuck Bailey reviewed the process for clubs to be able to obtain a camera to use with the KidSight vision screening process, and suggested that any club interested in applying for a grant to obtain a camera needs to speak with him.

2nd VDG Paulette reminded us that when a new club charters then a Charter Night Celebration needs to occur within 3 months of chartering, and that other Lions clubs should support the newly chartered club by their presence and their gifts at the Charter Night Celebration.

2nd VDG Paulette Bailey reminded members that the Worldwide White Cane Day is October 15, 2019 and encouraged clubs to continue to support the White Cane effort by sending in donations. She reminded us that the Reverse Raffle to support our White Cane Charities will be held on June 20, 2020 at the Ftn. City Lions Club building and will be known as "Day With the Lions". Hours are 12:00 – 5:00 PM and families are encouraged to attend. DG Carol reminded members to express to their clubs that the Reverse Raffle donations are in addition to our regular club White Cane donations (and not in place of our White Cane donations). PDG Ed Gibbons asked if donations to White Cane could be given today, and the answer was "yes". President of the Johnson City Noon Lions Club, Debra Shipley, presented a White Cane check for \$1,000. to PDG Cabinet Treasurer Chuck Bailey. Cabinet Secretary Kim Osborne explained that the money raised from the sale of the Lions Lenses jewelry today by the Sevier County Lions Club would also be donated in the future to the White Cane charities.

Tennessee Lions Learning Institute (TLLI) ~ April 16-18, 2020 at Montgomery Bell State Park. This will be the first one held in many years in TN and is open to all Lions. 2nd VDG Paulette encouraged members to attend, especially new Lions and Lions who may be interested in moving into leadership positions. PDG Chuck reported that the cost for the Institute will be announced at a later time and that the cost will be funded partially by LCI, in addition to District scholarships being considered. 2nd VDG Paulette reiterated that this TLLI is not meant to be in competition with the upcoming Lions Learning Retreat that is scheduled for January 17-19, 2020 in Manchester, TN.

Peace Poster Contest - Lion Nellie Harshbarger reminded clubs that the postmark deadline for submitting a Peace Poster winner to DG Carol McDonald is November 15, 2019. Peace Poster kits must be purchased from LCI by October 1, 2019. DG Carol encouraged all clubs to consider participating in the Peace Poster contest.
