NORRIS LIONS CLUB LENDS SUPPORT TO LOCAL FOOD PANTRY

Grocery carts get a lot of wear at the Norris Area Food Pantry. In one month alone this year, over 15,000 pounds of food were carried through the Food Pantry's aisles to serve nearly 200 needy families representing 600 people in the Anderson County High School District. Norris Lions Club members, some of the staples of this community-operated program, recognized the need for cart repairs last spring and asked their own organization to take on the project. Within a few months funds were allocated, and volunteer Lions had replaced sixteen new wheels on existing carts and repaired several others. Four additional carts were purchased and modified for operation.

At the August 18 meeting of the Norris Lions Club, Wayne Morris, a long-time volunteer for the Food Pantry reported, "We now have enough carts, and we will repair them and replace wheels as needed." And the Pantry's efficiency has been significantly enhanced. The Pantry is now able to serve 50-60 families per hour.

Since the Food Pantry's beginning in 1997, individual Lions Club members have donated many hours of work every month, unloading food, removing large amounts of scrap cardboard, cleaning the Pantry, sorting food, and repackaging meat and dry goods.

Dear Lions,

I see by our records that many of you are first time Presidents. Congratulations on being selected to this important leadership role! For you experienced Presidents, welcome back. As our new International President Tan said to a group of club Presidents, "There are only two positions in all of the Lions Organization that are important enough to be called President. Mine and

Yours." As a past club president, I can assure you it's a very satisfying job.

For some of you, I sent this letter to your club secretary or treasurer as I don't have your email address. My email address is not in the directory either, so I would appreciate it if those of you who received this letter in that fashion, would send your email address to me at rriehn@knology.net.

While I won't be able to get to every club, I do intend to visit as many as possible to present a 20 minute program about the Foundation, how it benefits people around the world and right here in Tennessee. It includes a very interesting video called "Lions Quarterly" which is a newsreel showing what lions like yourselves are doing in other parts of the US and around the world as well as projects the International Foundation is involved in.

My purpose as LCIF Coordinator is to effectively promote and support club participation in LCIF and its programs. Nearly all the funding for LCIF comes in the form of donations from individual Lions Clubs.

LCIF donations are a good value for us in Tennessee. In many previous years, we received more in grants, than we contributed. In 2010, our own District 12-N was awarded a \$75,000 grant for the Morristown Lions Volunteer Blind Industries building expansion. In addition to that, we are still in the process of distributing a \$10,000 disaster relief Grant to the Greene County Tornado victims. Our fellow Tennesseans, in the past 12 months, have received, or are in the process of receiving, \$160,000 in disaster relief grants. In recent years, our district has received grants for those who suffered with the tornados in Morgan and Roane counties, , the Elizabethton floods, the Braille Trail in Kingsport, and others. Later this year, our district will be applying for a grant to help in refurbishing the mobile eyeglass manufacturing van donated to us by RAM. Further details on this project will be provided later.

Now, while you are preparing next year's budget, is the time to determine how much your club can contribute. It is traditional that LCIF donations are given to the District Governor during his official visit to your club

Each donation of \$1,000 entitles the club to name a Melvin Jones Fellow. Donations of smaller amounts to the District are pooled to award, 'at large' MJF's. Clubs who donate \$10.00, for each member on their roster as of July 1, 2010, will be able to submit an applicant for consideration as an MJF by the District Governor and the

MJF district committee from this pool. Minimum club donation is \$200 for the smaller clubs.

The Melvin Jones Award, named after the Lions Club founder, is presented by the Lions Club International Foundation to Club members or private citizens for their outstanding community work. It is one of the Lion's most prestigious awards.

I request that you ask your club to select that outstanding Lion (or Lions), that deserves recognition and show the club's appreciation of a job well done. I believe that every club has at least one Lion member who deserves this award

Two of the Lions members are authorized Second Harvest shoppers, driving their own vehicles to pick up food. On distribution days other Lions serve refreshments to clients, interview, register and sign them in; then they assist them to their cars and help them unload their shopping carts.

The Norris Area Food Pantry is funded mainly by donations from various churches and private citizens in the Norris area. At different times throughout the year, food is collected by local schools, Boy and Girl Scouts and individuals. Some food is supplied free by Second Harvest and USDA, but most food from Second Harvest is purchased at reduced cost using donated funds. Historically the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the Anderson County community Action Committee have provided grants equivalent to about 1/3 of the Pantry's annual food costs. This year these funds will not be received. Unless the community increases their support, the assistance provided these needy families will be significantly reduced. Meanwhile the Norris Lions continue to increase their efforts to keep the Norris Area Food Pantry active and the food carts rolling.
